2000	Ptarmigan Easement	5.39	In East Vail, along Ptarmigan Road; Town of Vail; trailhead access into the National Forest
2001	East Vail Waterfall	4.97	In East Vail on Lupine Drive, just beyond the intersection with Bridge Road; Town of Vail; US Forest Service access
2003	Buffehr Creek Easement	9.29	On Buffehr Creek Road in West Vail, bounded on the North by the Vail North Trail hiking trail; Town of Vail; US Forest Service access
2004	Casteel Creek	118.09	Public trail easement though private property. On West Lake Creek, adjacent to White River National Forest
2005	Eagle River Preserve	71.70	Edwards, between the I-70 off-ramp and Highway 6; Eagle County Open Space; over 1 mile of Eagle River access
2006	Meadow Creek	2.64	In Vail, immediately south of Stephens Park, abutting National Forest land on the east; Town of Vail; Forest Service access
2006	Spud Cellar	35.19	Immediately north of the Eagle Pool and Ice Rink at the end of Bull Pasture Road; Town of Eagle
2008	Brightwater (Constellation Ridge)	95.00	Public trail easement though private property. South of Town of Gypsum; west of Valley Road; 3,924 feet of Gypsum Creek runs through property; includes entire ridgeline above creek
2012	Miller Ranch	32.50	West from Miller Ranch blue bridge, north side of Eagle River; South of railroad tracks; over 1 mile of Eagle River access

2012	Creamery Ranch Open Space	24.00	Public trail easement though private property. South of Edwards/southwest of Homestead; adjacent to Creamery Ranch housing development
2012	Homestead Open Space II	12.70	Public trail easement though private property. Trail systems winding throughout the Homestead neighborhood; 12.7 acres of 400 total acres of Homestead HOA
2012	The "L" Community Open Space	166.09	South of Edwards/south of Homestead; Eagle County Open Space; adjacent to Creamery Ranch and Homestead parcels

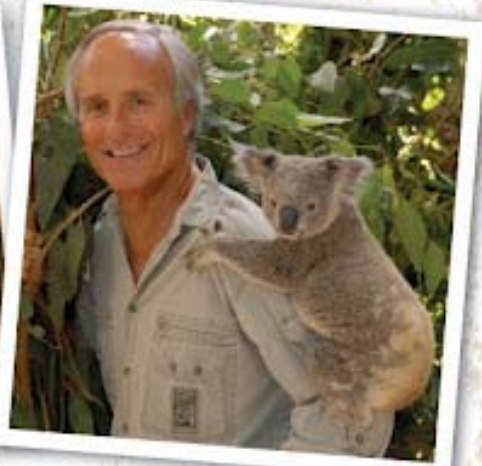
